A BILL

- To direct the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to establish a fund to provide financial assistance to individuals for funeral expenses related to a deceased individual who died of COVID-19, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "COVID–19 Funeral
- 5 Assistance Fund".

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1SEC. 2. FEDERAL ASSISTANCE TO INDIVIDUALS FOR FU-2NERAL EXPENSES.

3 (a) GENERAL RULE.—The Administrator of the Fed4 eral Emergency Management Agency shall provide finan5 cial assistance to individuals for funeral expenses related
6 to a deceased individual who died—

7 (1) of COVID–19; and

8 (2) without sufficient insurance to pay for such9 funeral expenses.

10 (b) ESTABLISHMENT OF FUND.—Not later than 30 11 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Ad-12 ministrator shall establish a fund to be known as the 13 "COVID-19 Funeral Assistance Fund" (in this Act re-14 ferred to as the "Fund") for the purpose of providing fi-15 nancial assistance under subsection (a).

16 (c) FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR FUNERAL EX-17 penses.—

18 (1) ELIGIBILITY.—

19(A) IN GENERAL.—To be eligible to receive20financial assistance from the Fund, an indi-21vidual shall—

(i) submit to the Administrator an application based on the criteria under paragraph (2); and

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1	(ii) demonstrate a common familial
2	relationship to the deceased individual de-
3	scribed in subsection (a).
4	(B) NO CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENT.—An
5	individual described in subparagraph (A) may
6	be—
7	(i) a citizen of the United States; or
8	(ii) a nonresident alien.
9	(2) Application criteria.—
10	(A) IN GENERAL.—The application under
11	paragraph (1) shall include the following:
12	(i) Funeral expenses with respect to
13	COVID-19 for a deceased individual de-
14	scribed in subsection (a) that were in-
15	curred or will be incurred during the pe-
16	riod beginning on January 21, 2020 and
17	ending on December, 31, 2021.
18	(ii) Proof of the date of death of the
19	deceased individual.
20	(iii) Proof that COVID-19 was the
21	cause of death (directly or indirectly) of
22	the deceased individual as determined by
23	the Administrator based on a death certifi-
24	cate from an official of competent jurisdic-
25	tion.

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1	(iv) Proof of the identity of the indi-
2	vidual applying for assistance under this
3	section.

4 (B) ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT IF IN-5 SURED.—If the deceased individual described in 6 subsection (a) had insurance not greater than 7 \$15,000, the application shall include proof of 8 insurance with respect to the funeral expenses 9 of the deceased individual.

10 (3) LIMITATION.—The amount allowed for a
11 payment to an individual pursuant to paragraph (1)
12 shall not exceed \$15,000 with respect to each de13 ceased individual described in subsection (a).

14 (4) NO REQUIREMENT TO RESIDE IN A PRESI15 DENTIALLY DECLARED DISASTER AREA.—The Ad16 ministrator may not require an individual to reside
17 in a Presidentially declared disaster area to receive
18 financial assistance pursuant to this section.

(d) VERIFICATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS REQUIREMENTS.—In carrying out this section, the Administrator shall—

(1) verify the identity and address of an individual that receives financial assistance under this
section;

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(2) minimize the risk of making a duplicative
 payment for a fraudulent application under this sec tion;

4 (3) recover any duplicate payment provided5 pursuant to this section; and

6 (4) conduct an expedited and simplified review
7 and appeal process for an individual whose applica8 tion for assistance under this section is denied.

9 (e) FUNERAL ASSISTANCE DISREGARDED IN ADMIN-ISTRATION OF FEDERAL PROGRAMS.—Notwithstanding 10 any other provision of law, financial assistance provided 11 12 to an individual under this section shall not be taken into 13 account as income, and shall not be taken into account as resources for a period of 12 months from receipt, for 14 15 purposes of determining the eligibility of such individual for benefits or assistance (or the amount or extent of bene-16 fits or assistance) under any Federal program or under 17 any State or local program financed in whole or in part 18 19 with Federal funds.

(f) DIRECT APPROPRIATION.—There is appropriated,
out of amounts in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020,
\$500,000,000 to carry out this Act.

24 (g) PRESIDENTIALLY DECLARED DISASTER AREA25 DEFINED.—The term "Presidentially declared disaster

1~ area" means an area for which the President has declared

2 a major disaster under section 401 of the Robert T. Staf-

3 ford Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C.

4 5121 et seq.).
